Why We Celebrate D-Day

Brief History

We celebrate D-Day because it was the beginning of the end of WWII; it was the result of the largest successful amphibious military operation in history. This began with allied leadership planning the liberation of France from the Axis powers after it was decided the Italian campaign was not going to be sufficient for a complete victory. This led to the creation of the "Overlord" plan, the day this plan was executed it became known as the day the Axis fell. Leading to that day being given the moniker D-Day. D-Day was once celebrated as liberation of millions of people from the authoritarian claws of the Nazis, but in recent years, D-Day is celebrated as a day of remembrance for all who served or passed in the line of duty.

The Nationalists trickled into the theater; taking them about 10 minutes to sit down even though most came in at a timely manner, except for City Six (Jackson City). During the last applause at the end of the presentation one of the delegates yelled "We love you," and in response one of the Marines yelled "I love you too". The program ended with a smooth exit from the

As the rousing Federalist State Party Convention came to an end, the boisterous Federalists filed into Yvonne theater, taking several minutes before finally being seated – nothing out of the ordinary. Norcross Enterprise Charges

This week, Attorney General Matthew J. Platkin and the Office of Public Integrity and Accountability, also referred to as the OPIA, announced the filing of criminal charges against the illegal enterprise run by George S. Norcross III, Norcross Enterprise. The indictment alleges that as early as 2012, Norcross Enterprise used its power and influence to pass legislation tailored to serve solely the interests of the enterprise. In response, all six of the following Norcross employees were charged with first-degree racketeering, where a set of illegal activities aimed at commercial profit are disguised as legitimate business deals.

All of the offenses listed are violations in both the first and second degree. First degree charges carry a prison sentence of 10-20 years alongside a 200,000 dollar fine. In contrast, second degree charges face criminals with a maximum 10 year sentence accompanied by a 150,000 dollar fine. However, it's important to remember that these charges are simply allegations, and nothing is set in stone until the defendants are proven guilty.

As New Jersey Statesmen, it is our responsibility to make sure that corporations and businesses are acting with moral integrity and transparency. By doing this, not only does our state benefit, but also our many counties and municipalities. As stated by Attorney General Platkin, "Today we reaffirm that no one in our state is above the law – period".
